## THE BIBLE ON ANGER

What God thinks about it; why to avoid/control it;

- **Proverbs 12:16** A fool's wrath is quickly and openly known; but a prudent man ignores an insult. (Amp).
- **Proverbs 14:29** He who is slow to anger has great understanding, but he who is quick-tempered exalts folly. (NAS)
- **Proverbs 15:1** A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger. (NIV)
- **Proverbs 15:18** A hot-tempered person stirs up conflict, but the one who is patient calms a quarrel. (NIV)
- **Proverbs 16:32** He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who captures a city. (NAS)
- **Proverbs 19:11** The discretion of a man makes him slow to anger, and his glory is to overlook a transgression. (NKJV)
- **Proverbs 29:11** A shortsighted fool always loses his temper *and* displays his anger, but a wise man uses self-control and holds it back. (Amp)
- **Proverbs 30:33** As the churning of cream yields butter, and a blow to the nose causes bleeing, so anger causes quarrels. (TLB)
- Ecclesiastes 7:9 Do not be quickly provoked in your spirit, for anger resides in the lap of fools. (NIV)
- Ephesians 4:26 Be angry, and yet do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger. (NAS)
- **James 1:19,20** Understand this, my dear brothers and sisters! Let every person be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger. For human anger does not accomplish God's righteousness. (NET)
